## I DIDN'T CHOOSE THE ROLE, THE ROLE CHOSE ME

It seems that Lebogang Koloti was destined for his role at Gradidge Mahura Investments, his initial host for the <u>ASISA Academy Independent Financial Advisor (IFA) Internship</u>, although his arrival was delayed by four years when his father passed away.

Those four years were certainly not wasted as Koloti learnt "just about everything he knows" at Futurum Financial Group, the Potchefstroom practice he was transferred to during the internship, allowing him to complete it and be near his family. He also had the valuable experience of being a 'local expert' commenting on financial news on a community radio station based in Potchefstroom.

Koloti didn't always seem destined for a job in the financial world. His brother had followed their parents into the South African Police Service, but Koloti always knew he wanted to do something different. He wasn't sure exactly what that was before hearing about the ASISA Academy IFA internship while in his final year of Honours in Financial Planning at the University of Johannesburg after completing his B Com Finance.

He applied to join the 2017 intake of the IFA Internship and was delighted when Gradidge Mahura Investments chose to host him. He remembers the work-readiness aspect of the IFA Internship well and says it is streets ahead of other programmes he has heard about. Koloti is very grateful for the introduction the interns were given. "People underestimate the training that they get, especially the softer skills. Then, an opportunity arose to rejoin Gradidge Mahura Investments as a financial advisor in Johannesburg, bringing Koloti's story full circle. He was pleasantly surprised to see how much the business had grown over such a short period of time.

Tatenda Macheka, a Certified Financial Planner (CFP) and practice manager at Gradidge Mahura Investments, said Koloti returned to Gradidge Mahura Investments with "the right attitude, that is, to learn and grow".
